President's Message

Aloha to our Hawaiian Acres community members. Another year has passed, and it's time to report what our Association has accomplished and what we hope to see come to fruition next year.

In many respects, 2022 was a transitional year. The COVID-19 crisis brought challenges to all of us. However, we were able to work with government and non-governmental agencies to bring food, programs, and other much-needed resources to our neighbors and community. We secured over \$7,000 in grant funds to keep the doors open and administer these vital programs for families in need.

This year, we finished our building remodeling upgrades. A special thanks to Garimo Pape for helping make our kitchen a bright and welcoming place! None of the work would have been possible without the generosity of our volunteer workers, who completed the flooring and other work at a fraction of the cost.





With an increase in younger families moving into our neighborhood, we also enhanced our community grounds for everyone to enjoy. The first phase was our playground upgrade – completed in June – which included adding a multifaceted playground module with a slide, tunnel, and climbing unit. We upgraded our classic swings with new chains and safety locks and installed a pair of seating benches attached to the playground area. We also added two new concrete picnic tables on our front lawn area, financed directly using our weekly Farmer's Market receipts. Our next project is to build simple shelters over the tables so that, rain or shine, everyone can enjoy the tables for a picnic lunch or use the Wi-Fi available provided in your yearly membership.

Our community has been growing, and we want to welcome all new landowners. We hope you will join our Association and take advantage of the programs and classes offered by our talented residents. From art classes to yoga, if you wish to share something with community members, let us know. We have competitive rental rates for members, and high-speed internet is included with your \$30 annual dues. Would you like to hold a conference or meeting? We now have Zoom available (an added fee applies). Please check with the office for rental terms.

Our board would like to thank our loyal members who, with your generous support, were able to complete these community projects this year.

Owner Transfers

For 2022 we had 176 properties with different owners. This compares with 188 ownership changes in 2021. As of December 2022, 34% of our property owners have off-island addresses.*

During 2022 we were not able to offer newcomers with a greeting letter describing the facilities within the subdivision and for the surrounding area. In the upcoming year, we hope to have more volunteer help `to restart this service.
